These individuals work with programs that have a proven track-record and offer effectiveness models and best practices for other programs to emulate. Program emphasis includes nonprofit effectiveness, economic development, community empowerment, and women's advancement.

## Rachel Griego – Denver, CO

Project Director at the Latino Community Foundation of Colorado where she directs the Latinas LEAD program. The Latinas LEADS initiative invests, trains and connects Colorado Latinas into a future leadership pipeline. The Foundation funds Latino programs throughout the state. Rachel earned a B.A. in political science and has previously served as a special Assistant to the Director of the Women's Bureau at the U.S. Department of Labor.

#### Sylvia Puente – Chicago, IL

Executive director of The Latino Policy Forum and has taken the organization to new heights. In 2009 she initiated the Illinois Latino Nonprofit and Multicultural Leadership Academies which has trained over 175 leaders from 75 organizations. The Academy's focus is on social change, policy impact, and improving the status of communities of color.
